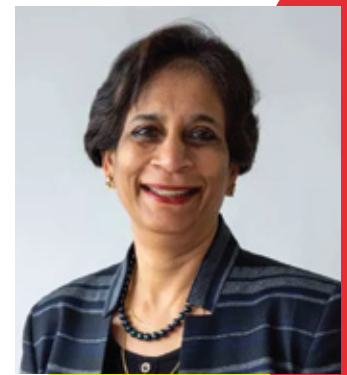
Integrate yoga into community based well-being initiatives

On the eve of International Day of Yoga (June 21, 2022), the WHO said policymakers should consider integrating Yoga into community based mental health and wellbeing initiatives while increasing efforts to leverage the potential of safe and effective traditional medicine. The UN agency's Regional Director for South-East Asia Poonam Khetrpal Singh said regular yoga practice can help people of all ages and incomes achieve adequate physical activity, making it a high-impact, cost-effective way to prevent and control noncommunicable diseases (NCDs)

India's progress on maternal health, nutrition has to be faster, bigger!

India has made significant strides on social progress indicators but its progress on nutrition, maternal and infant mortality rates needs to be bigger and faster, said Kanni Wignaraja, United Nations (UN) Assistant Secretary-General and Director, Regional Bureau for Asia and the Pacific, United Nations Development Programme (UNDP). She met senior government officials, including health minister Mansukh Mandaviya to discuss UNDP's work for the country's development. She said the way the India government has responded to global data on hunger, poverty and human development indicators has led to not just "a positive and much necessary debate" but also pushed better policy to ensure better results.

Novel Drug for Treatment of Type 2 Diabetes

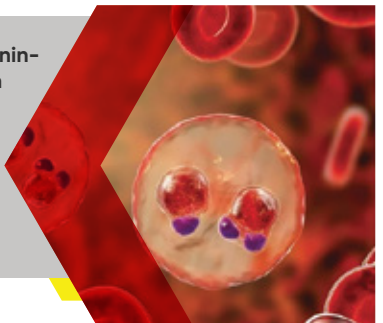

Diabetes is a major health problem in the world in general and India in particular. One potential therapy is a once-weekly injectable dual glucose-dependent insulinotropic polypeptide (GIP) and glucagon-like peptide receptor agonist (GLP-1). The drug causes the pancreas to release insulin and block the hormone glucagon. It also slows digestion resulting in individuals remaining full longer and eating less. Late phase II clinical trials reveals it reduces the HbA1c in type 2 diabetes and promotes weight loss. This could be a promising drug against Type II diabetes as well as obesity.

Treatment of Artemisinin-Resistant Plasmodium falciparum Malaria in India

Treatment failure in *P. falciparum* malaria is a major roadblock in Malaria management. True drug resistance is one of the causes after ruling out compliance and drug quality issues. The other cause is re-infection with a new strain of the parasite during the treatment period. The objective of the study was to understand the antimalarials prescribed in India for the treatment of Artemisinin resistant *falciparum* malaria. Documents published by the National Vector Borne Disease Control Programme were reviewed. It is found that a combination of oral Quinine and oral Clindamycin can be given for Artemisinin-resistant *P. falciparum* malaria.

GOING BEYOND



On a regular basis, the team across states in India, organizes Blood Donation camps. The units of blood collected are shared with Blood Banks, which in turn are used by people who need it in time of dire medical emergencies. These camps are done at villages in government hospitals or in High footfall areas. All precautions are taken to ensure the donor's safety is maintained.

Our Ambulance Crew on many occasions has stepped forward to donate blood at the time of duty without flinching and even thinking twice. This year we have decided to take this cause forward as our CSR initiative. We are donating a mobile blood collection van in Odisha and have pledged to collect 35,000 units of blood to save more human lives.

An Important Link

Asha Workers play a key role in ensuring health and welfare for women in rural areas. Empanelled by the government and trained to dispense education on how to stay healthy, they are indeed an important link between the government and pregnant women.

We at Ziqitza understand their importance and organize a host of awareness and training programs from time to time.
